

CHECKERED PAST



LANGHURNE 100 TO SGHNE

FRANKIE SCHNEIDER NATIONAL OPEN CHAMPION 1962



LANGHORNE, Pa., Oct. 16th. - Frankie Schneider, In fact, Abel passed the victor Flemington, N. J., auto mechanic, set two track records as he scored a convincing victory over 61 other cars in the 100-mile National Open championship for sportsman's modified stock cars Sunday before a sellout crowd of 25,000 at Langhorne Speedway.

Schnelder's time of one hour, 13 minutes, 16.42 seconds, equal to an average speed of \$1.884 mph. erased the marks of 1:15-12:16 and 79.784 mph by Dutch Hoag in 1960.

Following Schneider across the finish line were Pete Corey, Waterford, N. Y.; Bob Abel, Wrightsville, Pa.; Budd Olsen, Paulsboro, N. J., and Lorenz Alwine, Altoona, Pa. Only about 20 of the original starters finished in the race

Schnelder, who took the lead for keeps on the 17th lap from time trial leader John Mackinson, York, Pa., won about \$3500 for his afternoon's work. It was the second time he captured the event. He last did it in 1954.

The winning effort was made in a '37 Ford with a '62 Chevrolet engine.

The crowd sensed a sensational finish when Abel started to crowd Schnelder on the final five laps.

with about three miles to go, but he was not in the same lap with Schneider and therefore had to settle for a third-place finish.
