## Myrtle Falkinburg, Lady Champion

The summer of 1952, Mr. John Earlin from Browns Mills operated a race track in Manahawkin, New Jersey. During that summer he decided to have Powder Puff Derby's if enough women were interested. This was when I started to race. Mr. John Earlin owned two more race cars which he loaned to the women.
The first time I raced, I drove a car from Long Beach Island numbered \#6 7/8. Didn't win with this car. I drove Mr. John Earlin's car numbered \#711 a couple of times, didn't win with his cars. Mr. Louis MaCaluso asked me to try driving his car numbered \#7. I drove his car a couple of times and won both times.
During the summer of 1952 I was at New Egypt Speedway when they a had Powder Puff Derby's also. I entered the Powder Puff races there also. Drove in four races at New Egypt. I didn't have the same car each time I raced, so it was very hard to try to win. However I came in fifth the first time, third the next time, third the next time and second the last two times.
After Manahawkin Speedway closed, Mr. George Stockinger opened the Atlantic City Speedway in 1957. Mr. Stockinger decided to have Powder Puff Derby's also. They were held once a month.
This was when the women who drove decided to form an association. It was called "
The Women's Stock Car Auto Racing Association."
Mr. James Bilk from New Gretna let me have his car to drive. With his car numbered \#254 I won five out of eight races.
